Send more than just a prescription

Prescriptions sent through PrescribelT include key patient information from patient EMR files such as demographics, allergies, contraindications, height and weight. The pharmacist has the patient's complete medication picture, and can alert you to any concerns.

Manage renewal requests easily

Spend less time phoning, faxing and entering data, and help reduce errors. Renewal requests appear in the patient's record where you can accept, deny or modify them. Medications are matched to the patient by an e-prescription identifier as well as drug ingredients for additional clinical clarity and accuracy.

Prescribe even without an in-person visit

Even with a virtual patient encounter, you can still send prescriptions electronically to the patient's pharmacy, and pharmacists can request renewals from you.

Prescribers and PrescribelT-enabled pharmacies can exchange encrypted direct messaging to clarify information like generic substitutions, drug inventory and compounding, and to collaborate on patient medication therapy.



PrescribelT can help improve patient safety and adherence. Studies show that adherence is improved on the first fill when new prescriptions are sent electronically directly to the pharmacy.¹



PrescribelT informs you when a prescription has been dispensed, giving you an indication of patient adherence. This information can also help reduce the risk of inappropriate medication use.



You're informed if a patient's medication regimen or dosage has been changed by a specialist or another physician when a renewal or a modification is requested by a PrescribelT-enabled pharmacy.

Recently, I issued a request for a patient's refill to his pharmacist through PrescribelT for a medication previously prescribed by another provider. I was immediately alerted that the patient was also being prescribed methadone by a clinic. PrescribelT allowed us to identify this deadly combination and avoid a catastrophic patient event.
